### What's here already

All rooms have furniture, cable connections and Wi-Fi. The women's residence hall has up to six in a suite, two in each room and two bathrooms. The men's residence hall has up to four in a suite, two in each room and one bathroom. There are two of the following in every room: bed, desk, chair and closet. Cable is provided in all residence halls.

- Clothing for all types of weather

### **Optional Room Items**

- Throw pillows
- Egg crate-style pad
- Area rug
- Floor lamp (no halogen lamps)
- Single serving coffee makers (no regular coffee pots)
- Extra shower curtain and shower rod (one is already provided)
- Air purifier/fresheners
- Floor length mirror
- Shower caddy, basket, or buckets for health, beauty aids, and toiletries
- Hand soap
- First Aid Kit (Band-Aids, mercury-free thermometer, pain reliever, etc.)
- Extra storage containers
- Toilet paper
- Snack food

- Sponges/rags
- All-purpose cleaners
- Laundry detergent
- Paper towels

## Items to leave at home

- Open-coiled cooking appliances (toaster ovens, hot plates, etc.)
- Cooking grills (George Forman)
- No grills of any kind
- Griddles
- Deep fryers
- Open flame appliances
- Coffee pots (Keurig type/single brewers are allowed)
- Space heaters
- Halogen lamps
- Candles/incense
- Anything with an open flame
- Decorative alcohol containers
- All pets
- Weapons (firearms, air soft pistols, guns, bb guns, knives, bows & arrows, and martial arts equipment)
- Cinder blocks or concrete blocks should not be used to stack the beds
- Explosives (fireworks and flammable liquids)
- Volatile liquids and substances of any kind (fuel, lighter fluid, open cans of paint, paint thinner, match light charcoal, and turpentine)
- Paper lamps or lanterns
- Items attached to/hanging from fire-safety equipment
- Outlet expanders
- Decorative lighting (holiday lights, neon lights, black lights, etc.)
- Illegal or non-prescribed drugs or drug paraphernalia
- High wattage appliances
- Weights or weight exercise equipment
